 The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (The Broadway, Thorpe Bay) Amendment No.** Order 2023

The effect of the Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) would be to amend parking controls on The Broadway, Thorpe Bay as follows:

• To revoke part of the Limited Waiting Bays, Mon – Sat, 9am – 6pm, 1hr no return within 4hr restrictions on both sides of The Broadway outside No.142 and outside No.153. The extent of the revocation will be 7 metres on either side of the road.

The changes for on-street parking will amend the following Order; The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021

Southend-on-Sea City Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 122 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the 1984 Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:

- Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to the liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021 (as amended) (To be known as 'The 2021 Order') shall have effect as though;
 - (i) The items represented on the plans in Schedule 1 to this Order shall replace those corresponding plans as listed in the appropriate Schedule to The 2021 Order (as amended).
 - (ii) To revoke part of the Limited Waiting, Mon Sat, 9am 6pm, 1hr no return within 4hr restrictions on both sides of The Broadway outside No.142 and outside No.153. The extent of the revocation will be 7 metres on either side of the road.
- 2. The effect of this Order is to (this article is an explanatory note this is not part of the Order) remove small sections of Limited Waiting Bays to facilitate a new informal crossing point /build-out along this shopping precinct, following concern from residents, councillors and local resident's associations, that there is no safe provision for members of the public or mobility impaired to safely cross. Furthermore, the position proposed for this informal pedestrian crossing point/build-out has been selected to be situated between 2 existing Disabled Parking bays (1 either side of the road) so to provide a safe crossing point for the most vulnerable members of the public at the most convenient location to them.

- The remainder of The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021 (as amended) shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4. This Order shall come into effect on the XX day of XX 202X and may be cited as "The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021. The Southend-On-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (The Broadway, Thorpe Bay) Amendment No.** Order 2023."

Statement of Reason/s

Proposals

It is proposed to revoke a small part of the Limited Waiting parking bays (7m either side of the road which would equate to 1 parking space either side or 2 in total) along The Broadway, Thorpe Bay to accommodate an informal pedestrian crossing point/build-out, so to ensure visibility for pedestrian wishing to cross the road is maximised and not obscured by parked vehicle parking within the remaining bays

Reasons

The permanent amendment to the parking restrictions in this area has been minimised so to ensure parking opportunity along The Broadway, Thorpe Bay is not adversely affected by this proposal.

The removal of these small sections of parking will facilitate a new informal crossing point /build-out along this shopping precinct, following concern from residents, councillors and local resident's associations, that there is no safe provision for members of the public or mobility impaired to safely cross. Currently, there is no informal/formal crossing point for members of the public to get from of side of the road, to the other.

Furthermore, the position proposed for this informal pedestrian crossing point/build-out has been selected to be situated between 2 existing Disabled Parking bays (1 either side of the road) so to provide a safe crossing point for the most vulnerable members of the public at the most convenient location to them. This is consistent with the Council's Vision and Corporate Priorities of Safe, Prosperous and Healthy.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

The sections which the City Council are using for the implementation of the proposed scheme as above are 1, 2, 4 and 122. The grounds that encompassed the reason for these proposals in Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 are:

- (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (b) for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road, or
- (c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

In addition, thorough consideration was given to the factors set out in Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 in proposing this scheme.

Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016

All of the associated signing and lining will be in accordance with Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (TSRGD) 2016.

Equality Act 2010

Thorough consideration was given to the equalities duty of Southend-on-Sea City Council under Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010.
