The effect of the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) is to:
To introduce a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone and a Prohibition of Vehicles at:
Ronald Hill Grove from its junction with Westleigh Avenue to its junction with Marine Avenue

Operation times: Monday to Friday, 8.20am - 9.20am and 2.40pm - 3.40pm

These changes will amend the following Order;

a) The Southend-on-Sea Borough Council (Various Roads) (Consolidation of Moving Traffic and Speed Limit) Order 2006 (As Amended).

The amendments shall come into operation on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2023 and may be cited as The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Various Roads) (Consolidation of Moving Traffic and Speed Limit) Order 2006 (As Amended) (Amendment No.4) Order 2023.

Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2023, the statement of reasons for making the Order and plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours, inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Civic Centre, Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea, SS2 6ER and at <a href="https://www.southend.gov.uk/tro">https://www.southend.gov.uk/tro</a>.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
