Southend-on-Sea City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 122 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the 1984 Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby give notice that it intends to make the following Amendment Orders:

- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (Hamlet Court Road Loading Bays) Amendment No.* Order 2025
- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places)
 (Map-Based) (No.27 Beaufort Street Disabled Bay) Amendment No.* Order 2025
- The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places)
 (Map-Based) (Progress Road) Amendment No.* Order 2025

The effect of the Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) would be as follows:

PTO1176 - Hamlet Court Road - Loading Bays

On the west side of Hamlet Court Road, it is proposed to remove the bus stop outside No.171 – 177, replacing this with a Loading Only bay, limited to 30 minutes, with no return within 2 hours, operating between the hours of 8am – 6pm.

On the east side of Hamlet Court Road, it is proposed to remove the bus stop outside No.162 –168 and replace it with a Loading Only bay, limited to 30 minutes, with no return within 2 hours, operating between 8am – 6pm.

PTO1274 - No.27 Beaufort Street - Disabled Parking Bay

To introduce a disabled parking bay outside No.27 Beaufort Street.

PTO1297 – Progress Road

- The 10 metre (m) taxi rank outside No.60 Progress Road is proposed to be revoked and replace with 10m of No Waiting at Any Time (double yellow lines).
- The 12m taxi rank outside No.60 Progress Road is proposed to be revoked and replace with 12m of No Waiting at Any Time.
- To introduce 6m of No Waiting at Any Time outside No.60 Progress Road.
- The proposal is to revoke 10m of No Waiting at Any Time adjacent to No.1 Brunel Road, replacing this with an 10m taxi rank.
- The proposal is to revoke 12m of No Waiting at Any Time opposite No.55 Progress Road, replacing this with an 12m taxi rank.



Statement of Reason

THE SOUTHEND-ON-SEA CITY COUNCIL (WAITING, LOADING, STOPPING AND PARKING PLACES) (MAP BASED) (NO.27 BEAUFORT STREET – DISABLED BAY) AMENDMENT NO.* ORDER 2025

Proposal

The proposals are to introduce a disabled parking bay at No.27 Beaufort Street.

Reasons

There are currently 2 types of disabled parking bays across the city. These are:

- a) Enforceable bays, which are formalised parking spaces for blue badge holders only. These bays are supported by a TRO, enabling Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) to be issued for misuse.
- b) Advisory bays, which are informal courtesy bays intended for use by specific residents with a blue badge. These bays are not legally enforceable but rely on other motorists to show consideration by not parking there.

Over time, the presence of both types of bays has led to public uncertainty about who may legally use them and whether enforcement action applies. This has occasionally resulted in unintended inconvenience in certain cases.

The Council's 2024-2028 Corporate Plan includes a priority to be "a transforming Council delivering efficient, cost-effective services". To support this, a formalised policy was developed to improve support for blue badge holders who require accessible parking near their homes, this policy can be found using the following link: https://www.southend.gov.uk/residents-parking-permits-1/residential-disabled-parking-bay-rdpb-policy/3.

The RDPB Policy introduces twice a year application windows, during which residents can submit requests for new disabled bays. Successful applications result in a bay being installed and formalised through a TRO amendment to ensure it is enforceable.

In parallel, any existing enforceable bays that have been confirmed as no longer required will be revoked as part of this amendment process, also in batches of 25, twice a year.

The amendments proposed, are part of the first batch of disabled bay applications being progressed under the new Policy.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

The sections which the City Council are using for the implementation of the proposed scheme as above are 1, 2, 4 and 122. The grounds that encompassed the reason for these proposals in Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 are:

- (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (b) for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road, or
- (c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

In addition, thorough consideration was given to the factors set out in Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 in proposing this scheme.

Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016

All of the associated signing and lining will be in accordance with Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (TSRGD) 2016.

Equality Act 2010

Thorough consideration was given to the equalities duty of Southend-on-Sea City Council under Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010.
