

THE SOUTHBEND BOROUGH COUNCIL (WAITING, LOADING, STOPPING AND PARKING PLACES) (MAP BASED) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2021

THE SOUTHBEND-ON-SEA CITY COUNCIL (WAITING, LOADING, STOPPING AND PARKING PLACES) (MAP BASED) (HIGHLANDS BOULEVARD) AMENDMENT NO.1 ORDER 2026

Notice is hereby given that Southend-on-Sea City Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, and 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 , and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act has made the following Orders:

The effect of the Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) would be as follows:

PTO1195 – Highlands Boulevard

- a) At the junction of Buxton Avenue and Highlands Boulevard, extend the No Waiting at Any Time (double yellow line) restrictions to 10 metres.
- b) At the junction of Ewan Way and Highlands Boulevard, extend the No Waiting at Any Time restrictions to 10 metres.

The amendments shall come into operation on 19th January 2026 and may be cited as ‘The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021’:

- ‘The Southend-on-Sea City Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map-Based) (Highlands Boulevard) Amendment No.1 Order 2026’.

The changes for On-street parking will amend the following Order: ‘The Southend Borough Council (Waiting, Loading, Stopping and Parking Places) (Map Based) (Consolidation) Order 2021’. Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 19th January 2026, the statement of reasons for making the Order and plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours, inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Civic Centre, Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea, SS2 6ER and at <https://www.southend.gov.uk/tro>.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
